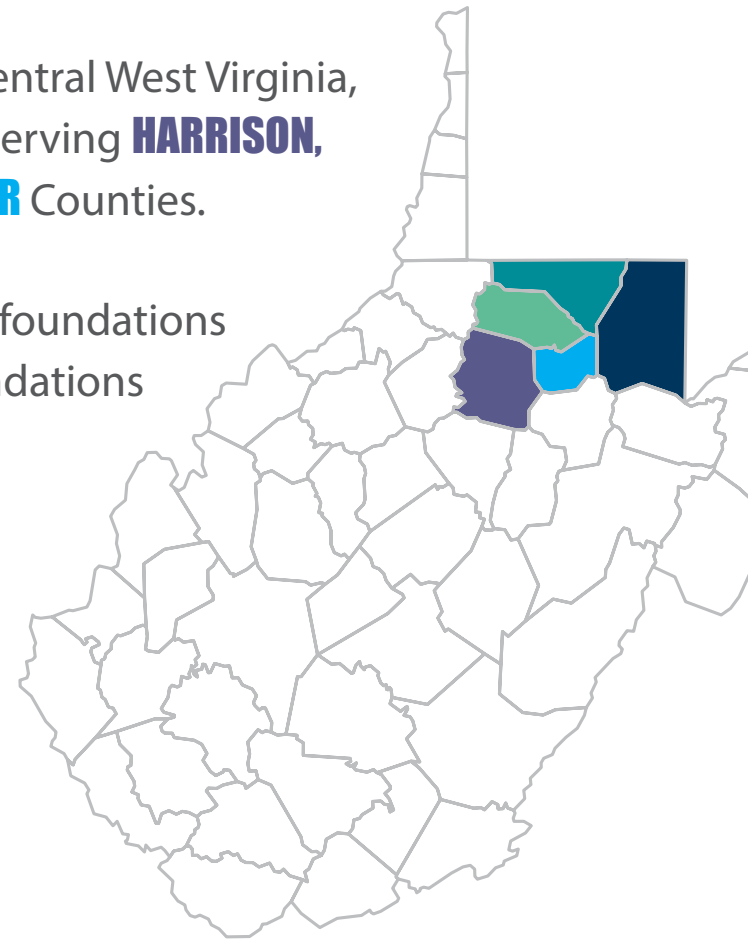

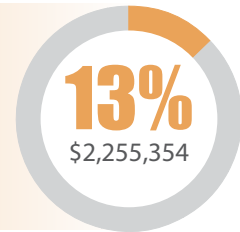

TYPES OF FUNDS

YCF offers a variety of funds to meet both donor and community needs. Donors select the fund name and determine the fund purpose. The fund is invested by YCF, and the annual earnings may be awarded based on the donor's wishes. For a full list of current funds, please visit ycfww.org.

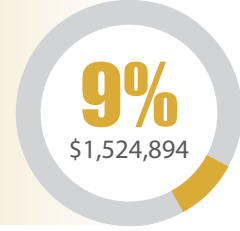
AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUNDS provide long term investments for local nonprofit organizations. Annual earnings support a nonprofit's greatest needs while YCF assumes reporting and investing responsibilities.



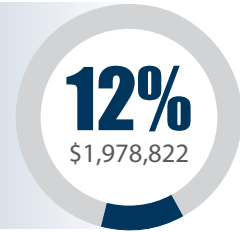
DONOR ADVISED FUNDS allow donors to actively participate in the grant-making process as a flexible way to address charitable interests as they change over time. Donors can involve their children as advisors to perpetuate a family tradition of philanthropy.



DONOR DESIGNATED FUNDS enable donors, at the time the fund is established, to name one or more organizations to permanently benefit from the fund. YCF ensures the designated recipient(s) receive support as long as they remain in existence and continue to fulfill the intended charitable purpose.



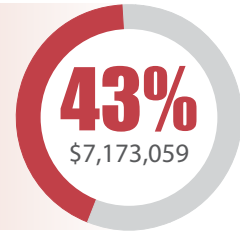
FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS allow the donor to address an area or issue of importance to the community. Fields of interest may include, but are not limited to, arts, environment, education, youth services, animals or health care. The endowment may grow through gifts from others who see them as a way to address their own charitable interests. Under the direction of the YCF Board of Directors, grant-making addresses the specific area identified by the fund.



IMPACT FUNDS are donated without stipulations or conditions; they allow YCF maximum flexibility to respond creatively and effectively to our communities' most compelling needs and opportunities. These funds are among the Foundation's most important assets to address long-term community planning. Grant-making from a fund is at the discretion of the YCF Board of Directors within the bounds of the general charitable purposes of the Foundation.



SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS are established to assist students with education. Donors may determine eligibility requirements and can designate funds for any level of education. Distributions are made in accordance with YCF policies, providing funds to the specific institution in which the student is enrolled.



NON-PERMANENT / PASS THROUGH FUNDS are established for unique broad-based charitable efforts in the community. The funds remain in cash to provide support for a designated period of time.



On December 31, 2019, YCF managed assets totaling \$16,725,733.

NEW FUNDS IN 2019

Individuals, businesses and nonprofit agencies may establish endowment funds with YCF for a minimum of \$10,000. Scholarship funds require \$20,000. The minimum must be achieved within three years. The funds are invested and either restricted for a specific charitable purpose or unrestricted for the greatest needs of the community.



Addiction Prevention Initiative Fund

Provides support for programs designed to lessen and alter the destructive impact of alcohol and drug addiction on children and their families through education and professional support at the grassroots level.



Bonnie Bailey Dyslexia Advocacy Fund

Established by Rachel and Todd Wood in honor of their friend Bonnie Bailey

Provides support for charitable causes to educate, advocate and increase general awareness of dyslexia.



FOCUS WV Brownfields Program

Established by the Historic Morgantown Post Office Building, Inc.

Provides support for renovations and upkeep of the historic building.

Established by the estate of Flora O. Corpening, J.P. Morgan Chase Bank, N.A.

Marion County

Jacob David Bower "Bower Power" Memorial Scholarship

In 2011, Dean and Ginger Bower established the Jacob David Bower "Bower Power" Memorial Scholarship in memory of their son Jacob, who was a cadet at the United States Military Academy at West Point. The endowment provides approximately two \$1,000 scholarship awards annually to students graduating from a Marion County High School. Students shall demonstrate attributes of character, high academic promise, commitment and leadership qualities through involvement in school and community activities, as well as involvement in at least one varsity sport.

Harrison County

West Virginia Black Heritage Festival Fund

The West Virginia Black Heritage Foundation is well-known for its annual festival, which attracts about 10,000 visitors to downtown Clarksburg and celebrates African-American art, history and culture. The festival awards several scholarships each year to recognize students' contributions to Harrison County and also selects a senior king and queen who are positive youth role models. In addition to hosting the festival, the organization now owns the Kelly Miller Community Center in Clarksburg. Formerly known as the Kelly Miller High School, the historically Black school is named in honor of an important figure in the intellectual life of Black America.

Preston County

Food for Preston Endowment Fund

Since 1985, Food for Preston has been helping the hungry in Preston County. Services include maintaining 11 food pantries, a backpack program and educational outreach programs. Food for Preston works with all 10 Preston County schools PreK-12th grade, and feeds more than 1,650 people each month. More than 1,200 volunteers make this important nonprofit a success.

PFC Andrew Martin 'Bo' Harper Scholarship

Bikers, Bros & Bo, Inc. donated an additional \$10,000 to the PFC Andrew Martin 'Bo' Harper Scholarship, established with YCF in 2011. Bikers, Bros, & Bo, Inc. takes part in several charitable activities that support and honor military members and their families. The PFC Andrew Martin 'Bo' Harper Scholarship, awarded to a student graduating from a Monongalia or Harrison County High School, was established by Steven Harper in memory of his son, Bo, who was killed in action in 2011 at Kandahar Airfield, Afghanistan. Scholarship recipients demonstrate academic commitment and leadership qualities through involvement in school and community activities.

The Taylor County Charitable Interest Fund (TCCIF) was established in 2008 to foster a social, educational, economic, and cultural quality of life. In 2019, TCCIF awarded three grants to the: (1) Taylor County Middle School for support of a leadership course for eighth grade students, (2) Grafton-Taylor County Health Department for School-Based Health Clinic supplies, and (3) The Homestead Farm Center's RURAL program which teaches clients to grow and prepare their own healthy vegetables.

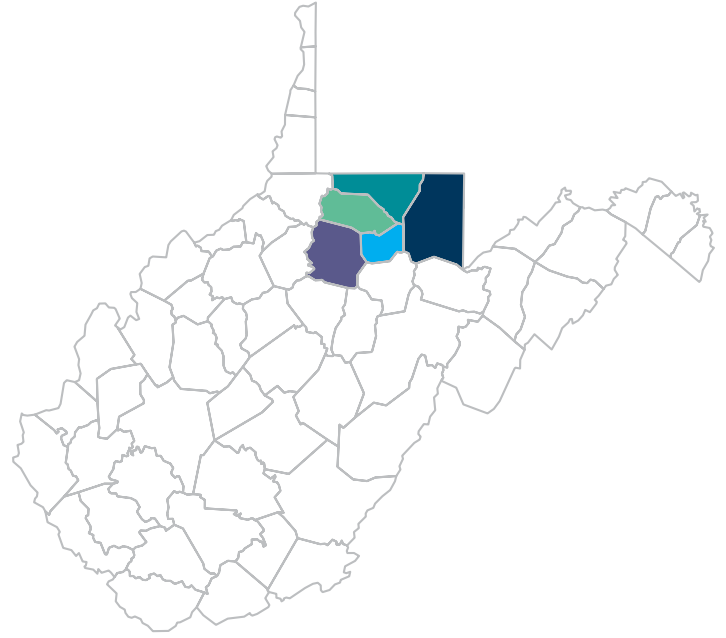
